DEPARTURE DAY	
Adjust the thermostat and double-check the door locks

Have photo ID and/or passport ready for check-in

ONLINE CHECK-IN	
You should complete your online check- in as early as possilbe. However, be	
sure to complete your online heck-in at least 3 days before departure. (You can do this It will speed up your check in process upon arrival at the port.	
To link your profile, go to My Disney Cruise on DisneyCruise.com	
ARRIVAL	
If flying to your destination, it is recommended to arrive the day prior to your cruise to allow for any delays or cancellations.	
If you are arriving the same day as departure, your flight should arrive no later than 1:30 PM. Earlier is better as the ship will leave without you.	
You should plan to arrive to the cruise terminal early and board your cruise no later than 2 hours before the scheduled departure time. Remember to	
allow time to check in prior to boarding.	





PREVIEW ACTIVITIES AND EXCURSIONS

Once your cruise is paid in full, you can review onboard activities and port adventures to begin planning your excursions. To do so, go online to DisneyCruise.com and follow link to My Disney Cruise. You will not be able to book anything until your check-in date.

YOUR CHECK-IN DATE

Your online checkin and booking date is based on your level.

- Platinum Members, Concierge Guests, Wedding Parties:
 120 days in advance
- Gold Members: 105 days in advance
 Sliver Members: 90 days in advance
 First Time Guests: 75 days in advance

CHECK-IN TIME

Check-in time starts at 12:01 EST.

That is when you can start booking your onboard activities, specialty dining, and port adventures.

For best availability, it is recommended to stay up late and make your reservations as soon as your window opens. Those include:

- Port adventures
- Adult dining
- Princess gathering (meet & greet)
- Frozen gathering (meet & greet)
- Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique
- Roval Court Tea
- It's Small World nursery reservations (if needed)

(The Princess and Frozen gatherings are free events but require reservations due to their popularity.)

You can then go to bed and come back later to finish the online check in process including:

- List type of documentation you will be providing (ie. passport, driver's license)
- Choosing port arrival time
- Register kids for youth clubs

BOOK ACTIVITIES FIRST

Since activities book up quickly, it is recommended to book those first, and then book your check in time. Regardless of your check-in time, boarding does not typically begin until 1:00 PM. Concierge guests will get first boarding priority.

HOW TO CHECK-IN

Go to DisneyCruise.com > Already Booked > My Reservation. It should already list your reservation. If not, you can add it with your confirmation number.

To make port adventures, go to My plans > Activities > Port Adventures. When you select the activity you want to book, select the guest from the list. For onboard activities, it works the same. My Plans > Select day > Add Activities.

If your desired activiteis are showing as "not available" you can try back at another time to look for a cancellation or check again once onboard.

BOOKING ACTIVITIES WITH ANOTHER GROUP

If you are traveling with another party, and want to book activites together, one person should be designated to do the booking for the both groups. Make sure you have the confirmation number of the other party AND at least one birthday from guests in that stateroom (ideally lead guest).

Go to DisneyCruise.com > Already Booked > My Reservation. It should already list your reservation. If not, you can add it with your confirmation number. There should be another link to add "Add Another Stateroom" (or add another reservation) to add your friends room. Enter in their confirmation number and birthday as required. Then you can to go book port adventures or onboard activities. You should see everyone's name listed.

If things are showing as "not available" it could be due to party size. Try adjusting the party size to see if you can get in. You can also try back and look for a cancellation or check again once onboard as well.

BOARDING THE SHIP

Regardless of your checkin time, boarding is typically between 1:00 and 4:00 PM. Stateroom are typically available around 1:30.


ADDITIONAL TIPS


- There is a question on the check-in form: "Are you flying in for your cruise". If you are flying in directly that day then answer "Yes". If you are flying in the day before (or more), answer "No" to that question. Otherwise it may get an error message.
- In the Youth Registration section, near child's name, there will be an Edit button. Be sure to click that and answer question regarding the allergy and other consideration. Otherwise it may get an error message.

TRAVEL PROTECTION INSURANCE

Travel protection insurance is strongly encouraged. One reason is that your US medical coverage will not be accepted out of the country. Contact your agent for available options and pricing information.

COMMON FAQS



SHOULD I BOOK A NIGHT'S ACCOMMODATION BEFORE MY CRUISE?

If you are flying in for your cruise, it is recommended to book a night prior to your cruise in the event of any unexpected delays with your flights. The ship will leave on time, with or without you. If you're flight is delayed and the ship leaves, you will need to find a way to meet the ship at it's next port. The same is true if you are late returning from a port excursion. Be sure to be on time!

WHAT IS THE EARLIEST RETURN FLIGHT I SHOULD BOOK?

The cruise will urge you to disembark the ship as early as possible as they need to prepare the ship for the next group of guests. Consider how far away the airport is from the port. For example, Port Canaveral is about 1 hours from Orlando airport. Your return fight home should be no earlier than 12:00 PM on your disembarkation day. However, you can consider adding another night hotel stay just in case of unforeseen delays.

WHAT ARE THE DRESS CODES ON BOARD?

On many cruise lines, are may be distinct types of evenings on board: casual, smart casual and formal. On a Disney cruise, you may also have Pirate Night. Suggested guidelines are as follows:

- Casual: sport shirts and slacks for men, sundresses or pants for women.
- Smart casual: jackets for men and dresses and/or dress pants for women.
- Formal: suits and ties or tuxedos for men and cocktail dresses or evening gowns for women.
- Pirate: from satin sashes and ruffled shirts to bandannas and a hoop earring. Even a tropical shirt will do. Just let your inner pirate out.

WHAT BEVERAGE PACKAGES ARE AVAILALBE?

Some cruise lines limit the beverages to mealtimes while others are more liberal. Disney does not offer an alcholic or soda Beverage package. Soda is included and alcohol can be purchased individually.

Guest may also bring beverages on board, but it MUST be in their carry-on items. Do not pack in checked luggage. Each adult day is permitted to bring 2 bottles of wine or champage (max) 750 ml OR one 6 pack of beer.

You are also permitted to bring bottled water or soda on board. Must be sealed, original container and packed into your carry-on luggage.

Personal alcohol must be consumed in your stateroom. If brought to a restaurant, there is a corking fee.

CAN I GET MY LAUNDRY DONE?

Disney ships offer full laundry and dry-cleaning services and this can be billed to your onboard account. Self-service washers, dryers and irons are available.

ARE THERE MEDICAL FACILITIES ABOARD THE SHIP?

Most ships travel with a doctor and registered nurse on board. They will also have reasonable medical facilities to handle emergency situations.

IT'S A SMALL WORLD NURSERY

Kids can romp, rest and do everything in between at this internationally themed childcare center.

- 6 months to 3 years
- Advance reservations are required and can be made online
- There is a charge for this service

OCEANEER'S CLUB

Children can interact with Disney characters—and each other—as they explore multi-themed magical lands

- 3 to 12 years old (young children must be potty-trained)
- Children must be checked in and out by a parent or guardian

OCEANEER'S LAB

Children can play and learn at sea through imaginative themed activities and games, offered daily.

- 3 to 12 years old
- Children must be checked in and out by a parent or guardian

Lab activities vary by ship and cruise. Some activities may include*:

- Stage (do your own plays)
- Animator studio
- Craft studio
- Media room with video games and big screen TV for movies
- Playmation (battle villains with The Avengers or Pirates)
- Wheel house (ship navigation simulator, or treasure hunt)
- Guided group activities such as, Anyone Can Cook, Super Sloppy Science with Professor Make-O-Mess, or Pluto's Pajama Party, to name a few.

DINE AND PLAY

For parents looking for a more quiet dinner, consider taking advantage of Disney's Dine and Play.

Available with second seating only, your children's dinners will be brought out earlier than yours. Then the counselors will come by to collect your children for an evening of fun while you enjoy a leisurely meal.

- Children are able to check in and out themselves
- 10 year olds may participate but must have signed consent

VIBE

At this teens-exclusive space, chill out, listen to music, watch TV, play group games and more with cruisers your age.

- 14 to 17 years old
- Children are able to check in and out themselves
- 13 year olds may participate but must have signed consent
- No 18 year olds permitted, even if 18th birthday occurs during the cruise

GALVESTON PORT TERMINAL

Port of Galveston 2702 Harborside Drive Galveston, TX 77550

MIAMI PORT TERMINAL

NEW YORK PORT TERMINAL

Parking is available at the Manhattan Cruise Terminal

PORT CANAVERAL PORT TERMINAL

Port Canaveral, Cruise Terminal 9155 Charles M. Rowland Dr. Port Canaveral, FL 32920

Parking is available adjacent to the cruise terminal. Preferred parking is available next to the terminal.

Approximate driving times to Port Canaveral:

- 60 minutes from Orlando International Airport
- 40 minutes from Melbourne International Airport
- 90 minutes from Walt Disney World Resort

PORT OF SEATTLE CRUISE TERMINAL

Port of Seattle 2001 W Garfield St. Seattle, WA 98119

Pier 91 serves as homeport for Celebrity Cruises, Princess Cruises and Royal Caribbean. Cruise terminal concierge offers luggage storage before and after cruises, plus city information.

Easy access to Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (30-40 minutes) and downtown Seattle retail core and famous Space Needle (10 minutes)

General parking is available for \$27 per day. Book online at Republic Parking Northwest. Complementary shuttle from parking to terminal..

PORT VANCOUVER CRUISE TERMINAL

Port Vancouer 999 Canada Place Vancouver, British Columbia Canada V6C 3T4

The port is located about 30 minutes from the Vancouver International Airport (YVR)

Convenient long-term parking is available.

SAN DIEGO PORT TERMINAL

Port of San Diego San Diego B Street Pier 1140 N. Harbor Drive Pier No: 330–334 San Diego, CA 92101

There is no parking at the cruise terminal; however, you may park at San Diego Airport in one of the off site parking facilities. Shared ride and private shuttle service is available from the airport to the Port of San Diego.

SAN JUAN PORT TERMINAL

Port of San Juan Pan American Pier, Terminal Isla Grande San Juan, Puerto Rico 00901

There are no parking facilities at the Port of San Juan. Public parking facilities are located in the area surrounding the port and are on a first-come, first-served basis.

TRANSFERS TO/FROM PORT

Be sure to include transfers in your plans. The cruislines will offer transportion for a fee. You can also hire a cab or Uber/Lyft. If you arrive the night before, some hotels will offer transfers between their hotel and the port.



GETTING TO PORT CANAVERAL

You have several options in getting from Orlando International Airport or Disney World Resort area to the cruise port.

DISNEY CRUISE LINE TRANSFERS

With Disney Cruise Line transfers, you will be picked up by motor coach (bus) at either Orlando airport or from a Disney hotel and taken to the port. If being picked up from Orlando airport, when checking luggage, you can put a DCL transfer tag on your luggage at your home airport and your bags will be checked all the way through to your stateroom.

Round trip transfers from Orlando airport of from a Disney hotel is \$78 per person*. The benefit of booking a DCL transfer is there are no worries about being late for the cruise. However, if you have a large family or group, this can be more expensive than other options

If arriving to or departing from Sanford Airport, you will have to use one of the other transfer services such as a car service.

DRIVING AND PARKING

Whether you have your own car, or a rental car, there is plenty of parking at Port Canaveral. Parking at Port Canaveral costs approximately \$17.00* per day including day of arrival and day of departure. For more information, visit https://www.portcanaveral.com/Cruise/Directions-Parking

There are also off-site parking lots available, which offer shuttles back to the port. One thing to consider is the additional cost of tips, plus the additional time that will add to your embarkation/debarkation process.

Another option is to arrive a day early and stay overnight at a local hotel. You can park at your hotel for the duration of the cruise. Most of the hotels in the area will provide shuttles to the port. Even factoring in the cost of the hotel stay, you may be able to save money this way, as opposed to parking at the port. It is recommended to arrive in the Orlando or Port Canaveral area a day early anyway, because then you're not worried about making it to the ship on time, or dealing with potential flight delays.

If renting a car, depending on the rental rate you get, you may find the cost of the rental plus the cost of parking is less expensive than other options, especially for a large group.

CAR SERVICES

While this seems like more of a luxury, if you have a bigger group it can actually be an economical option. The car will pick you up right at the door of your hotel, cruise ship or the airport and the driver will help you with your luggage. With a car service, you can schedule a pickup time that is convenient for you and you don't have to wait for a shuttle to fill before you can leave. Prices vary based on the size of the vehicle.
